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# Concise Help, Explanation, and Tips (CHEaTs)

- Remember that when a layer is locked, you may not be able to edit it! Look for the lock symbol.
- Know the difference between a type layer and a rasterized layer. Sometimes students accidently rasterize a type layer and then it is no longer editable.
- Be careful not to merge your layers. You need the layers in order to edit your Photoshop document correctly.

- Remember to organize your layers panel. When a project has multiple layers, it is easier • to find the layers you need if you group and label.
- Play with blending modes, opacity, and fill. You may get an even cooler effect than the tutorial!
- Play with layer styles and modify them to your liking. Often the best results are from just playing with the software.
